## LEGAL ACTION

- **Indigenous Child and Families Services and Jordans Principle Class Action**
  - These actions include claims on behalf of (1) all Indigenous children who were removed by child services, since 1991; (2) all Indigenous children who were denied essential services, since 1992 (1975 in Nunavik); and (3) family members caring for those children at the time that they were removed or denied an essential service.

## HEALTH SUPPORTS

- **Jordan's Principle for First Nations Children & Families**
  - Jordan's Principle is a legal requirement that provides access to supports for First Nations children in need and ensures that the government of first contact pays for the supports without delay.
  - A child under the age of majority in their province or territory of residence can access Jordan's Principle, if they permanently reside in Canada and if the child meets one of the following criteria: is registered or eligible to be registered under the Indian Act, has one parent or guardian who is registered or eligible to be registered under the Indian Act, is recognized by their nation for the purposes of Jordan's Principle, is ordinarily resident on reserve

- **The Inuit Child First Initiative**
  - ensures Inuit children have access to the essential government funded health, social and educational products, services and supports they need, when they need them. All Inuit children, no matter where they live in Canada, can request funding through the Inuit Child First Initiative. They must be: recognized by an Inuit land claim organization and under the age of majority in their province/territory of residence.
